Reasons	of the Neighbourhood Planning (Referendums) Regulations 2012 confirmed in a statement (Head of Planning and Strategic Housing - dated 15 July 2019) that the District Council was satisfied that the draft Hailey Neighbourhood Plan meets the basic conditions required. This statement followed suitable modifications to the Plan made in response to modifications recommended in the external independent examination of the Neighbourhood Plan (Independent Examiner's Report – dated 25 March 2019). The Neighbourhood Plan was cleared for referendum which was held on 29 August 2019. More than 50% of those who voted were in favour of the Plan being used to help decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area (see Declaration of Result of Poll – 29 August 2019). Paragraph 38A (4)(a) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 as amended requires that the District Council must make the neighbourhood Plan if more than half of those voting have voted in favour of the plan.

In accordance with this conclusion, the District Council's assessment of the plan, including its preparation, concluded that it does not breach nor is incompatible with the relevant legislation. The Decision Statement confirms that Hailey Neighbourhood Plan can now be made.
